Your 2013-2014 FAFSA was selected for review in a process called Verification. In this process, your school will be comparing information from your FAFSA with copies of your (and your spouse's if you are married, or your parent's if you are dependent) 2012 Household, and other documents. Federal Regulations state the college has the right to ask you for this information before awarding federal aid. Complete this verification worksheet and submit it, along with other required documents, to the financial aid office as soon as possible to avoid a delay in processing your financial aid. If you need help, contact the financial aid office at your school. *Your school must review the requested information under the financial aid program rules (34 CFR, Part 668) and submit corrections if necessary.*

B. Other Information to Be Verified

Complete this section if someone in the student's (or parent's) household* received benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or SNAP (formerly known as food stamps) any time during the 2011 or 2012 calendar years.

- Check here** – If one of the persons in my household* received SNAP benefits in 2011 or 2012. If asked by my school, I will provide documentation of the receipt of SNAP benefits during 2011 and/or 2012.

***Independent Student:** Include yourself, your spouse if you have one, and your children **if** you will provide more than half of their support from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. ***Dependent Student:** Include yourself, your parent/stepparent (even if you don't live with them), and your parent/stepparent's children who live with them. C. High School Completion Status

- A copy of the student’s General Educational Development (GED) certificate or GED transcript.
- An academic transcript that indicates the student successfully completed at least a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor’s degree.
- If state law requires a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a copy of that credential.
- If state law does not require a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a transcript or the equivalent, signed by the student’s parent or guardian, that lists the secondary school courses the student completed and documents the successful completion of a secondary school education in a homeschool setting.

If the student is unable to obtain the documentation listed above, he or she must contact the financial aid office.

D. Identity Statement of Educational Purpose

Submit a signed in person or with a notary statement of Educational Purpose to the college you will attend.

E. Certification and Signatures

Each person signing this worksheet certifies that all information reported on it is complete and correct. If student is dependent, at least one parent must sign.

Your financial aid cannot be processed until the financial aid office receives the required Verification documents. Your school must review the requested information, under the financial aid program rules (34 CFR, Part 668), and submit corrections if necessary.
