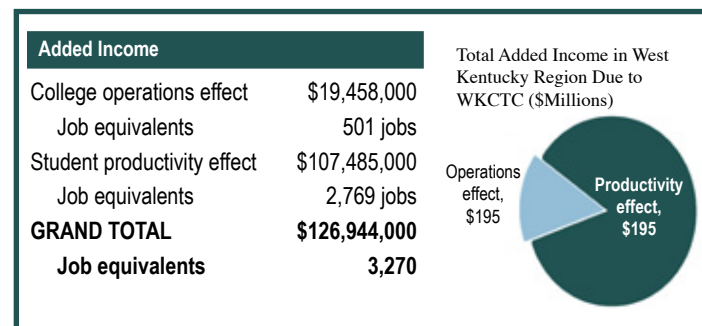
COMMUNITY/ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PARTICIPANTS (2010-2011)
